

Dr. George R. Franks, Jr., is an Assistant Professor of Government and teaches Criminal Justice and Public Administration at Stephen F. Austin State University. He also serves as the Co-Director of the Texas Certified Public Manager Program at SFA.

Dr. Franks holds a BA from the University of Alabama, MPA from the University of Arkansas at Little Rock, and a Ph.D. from Texas A&M University. He is a graduate of the University of Arkansas School of Law Enforcement Supervision; the Rural Law Enforcement Executive Management Institute; and the 193rd Session of the FBI National Academy.
