Specifically, this roundtable will examine how law enforcement presence in schools influences how juveniles, teachers, and parents develop feelings about the law and law enforcement. Examining how school environments can shape juveniles' attitudes about the law and legal authorities is important, as it may provide insight into how police-community relations can be developed, improved, and sustained. Discussions will touch on the limited qualitative studies measuring the impact of police in schools, the legal socialization literature, and hope to gain a deeper understanding of how youth, parents, and teachers experience the criminal justice system within an educational setting.
